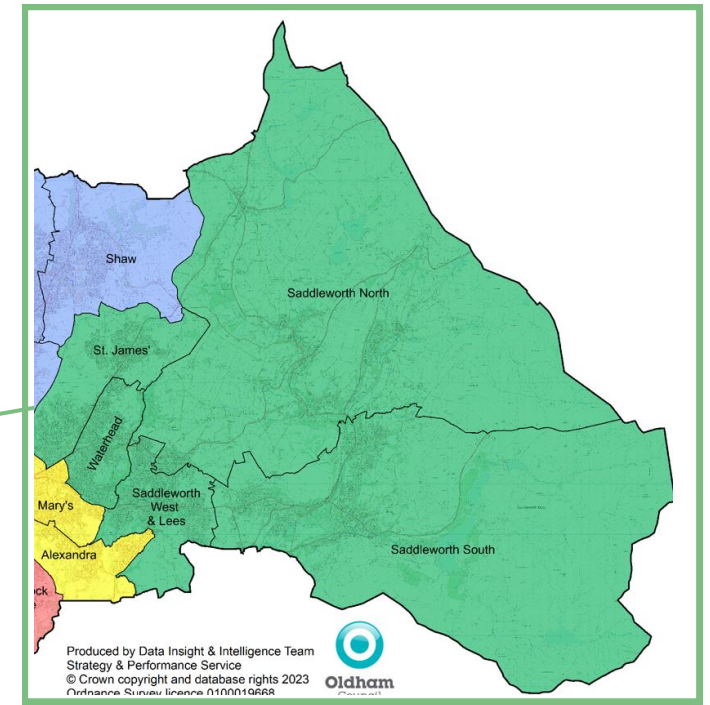
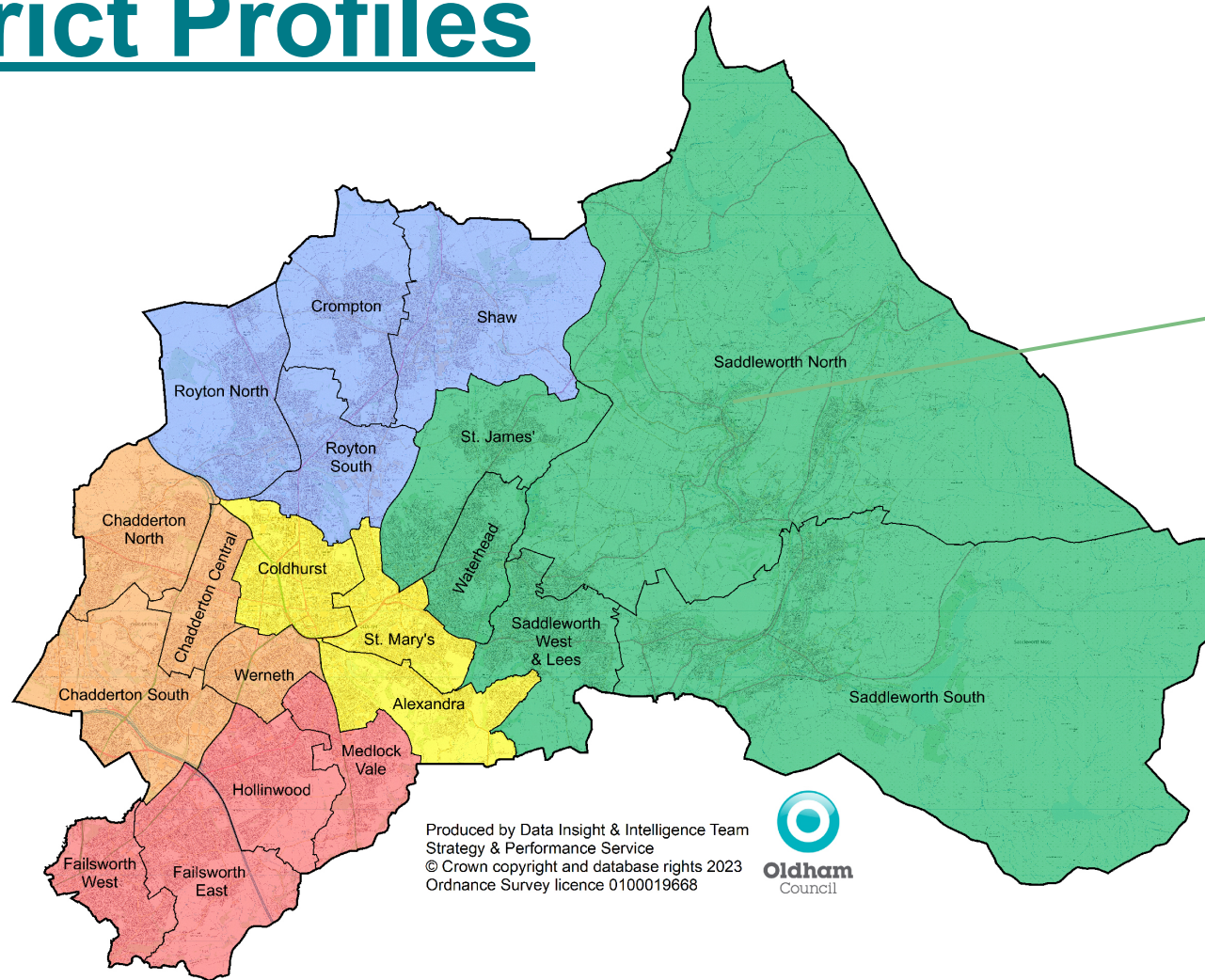

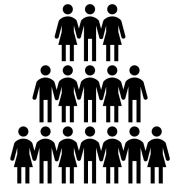


District Summary

- East District has the largest **population** across Oldham and the highest number of wards of any district. The district experienced one of the smallest population growths between 2011 and 2021. The district has an older than average population.
- East has the second lowest proportion of residents from a non-White British **ethnic background**.
- **Deprivation** levels are mixed across the district. Saddleworth North, Saddleworth South and Saddleworth West & Lees have low levels of deprivation, whereas St. James' and Waterhead have higher levels than the Oldham average.
- The **median house price** is also a mixed picture, with houses in Saddleworth North and South costing well above the national average and the remaining three wards averaging below that amount.
- **Socially rented homes** represent a smaller percentage of homes compared with the Oldham average and the proportion of **owner-occupied homes** is above average.
- **Unemployment and Youth Unemployment rates** are second lowest across Oldham. The Saddleworth wards have the three highest **median household incomes** across Oldham, rates for St. James' and Waterhead just fall short of the Oldham average.
- Pupils in East have good **learning outcomes**, with the highest district rates across all Key Stages with the exception of Key Stage 4, where performance falls below Oldham, North West and England averages.
- **Life Expectancy** is higher than the Oldham average for both males and females.
- Rates of **childhood obesity** are lowest across Oldham.
- **Adult Mental Health Referrals and Contacts** are low compared to Oldham. The district has a relatively high level of **Children's Mental Health** service use. It's important to note this doesn't necessarily reflect the prevalence within the population.
- East has the lowest rate of **999 ambulance calls**. **Hospital activity** levels are lower than average.
- East District has an average rate of both **Children's Social Care** activity and referrals. The district sees the highest proportion of its referrals from LA Services. **Adult Social Care** activity and referrals (age-standardised) are lowest across Oldham.
- The **crime rate** in the district is lowest across Oldham. St. James' and Waterhead experience a much higher rate than other North District wards.

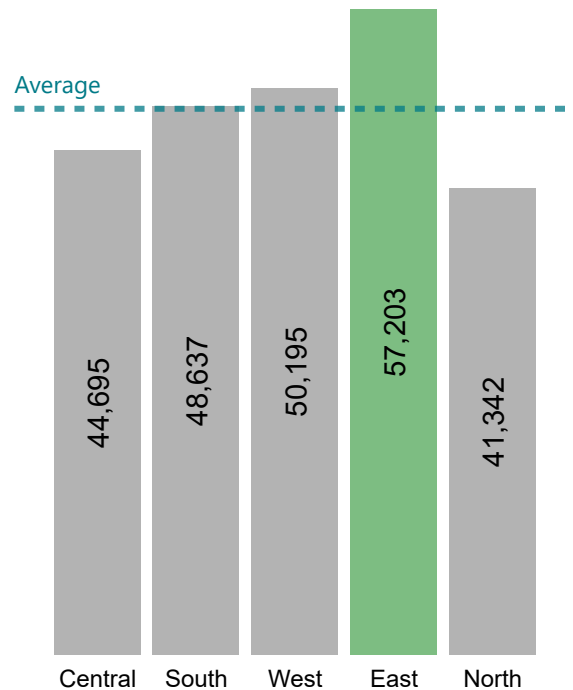

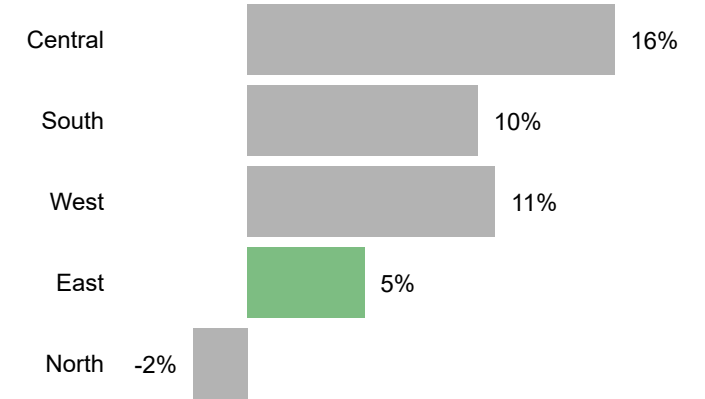
East District experienced one of the smaller population growth's across Oldham.



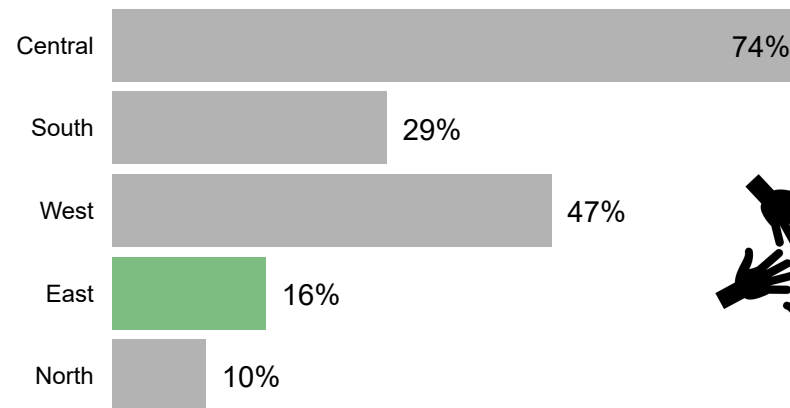
Whilst Oldham's population as a whole grew by 7.7% between 2011 and 2021, East's population grew by 5%.

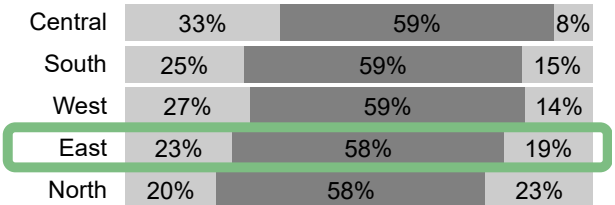

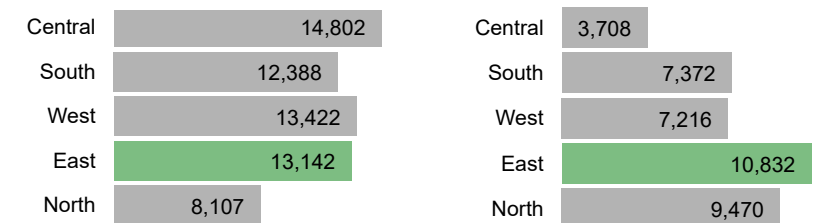

East's number of 0-17 year olds is similar to the Oldham average

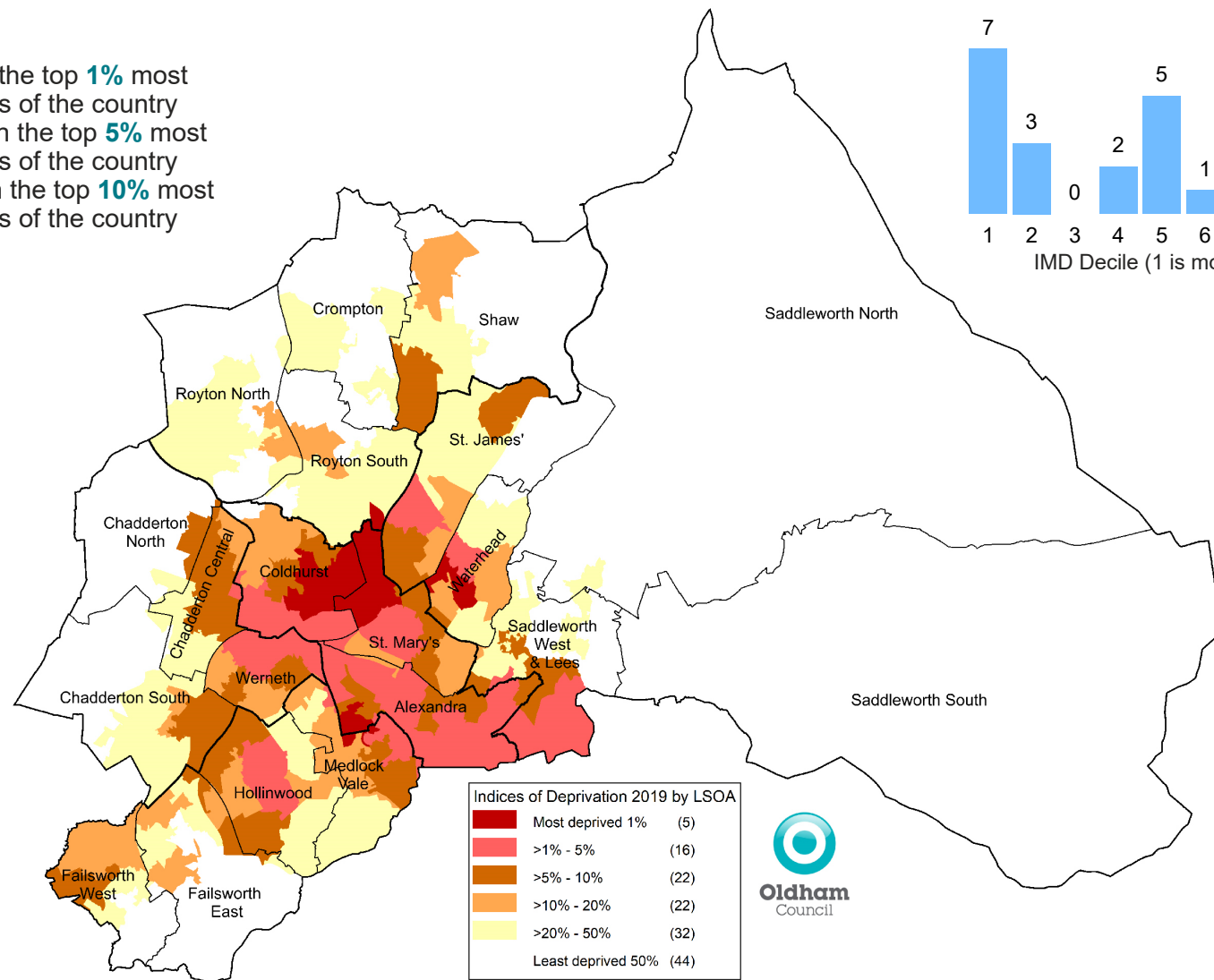

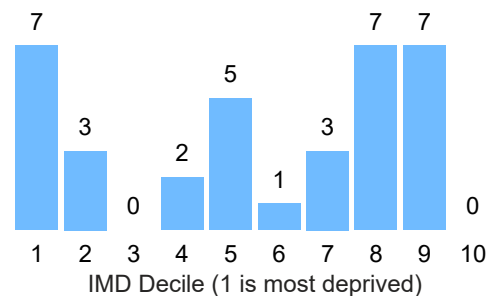

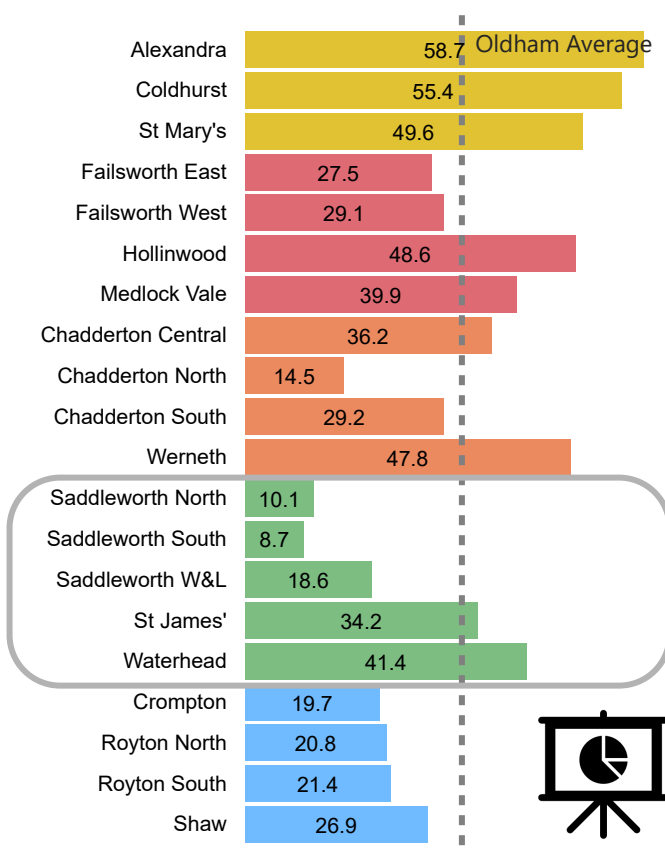
- **1 (2.9%)** is in the top **1%** most deprived areas of the country

IMD Deciles of LSOAs in East

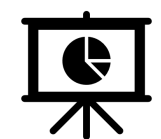


Average IMD Score



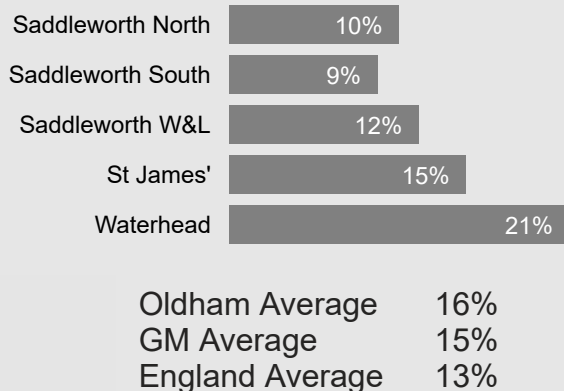
A higher score indicates a more deprived area.

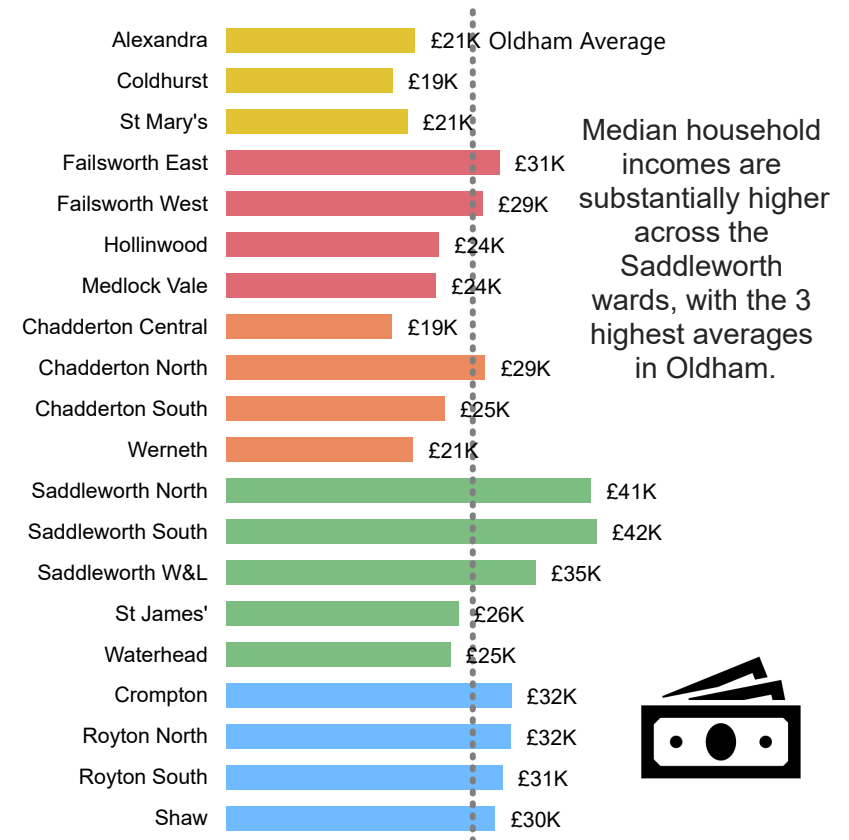
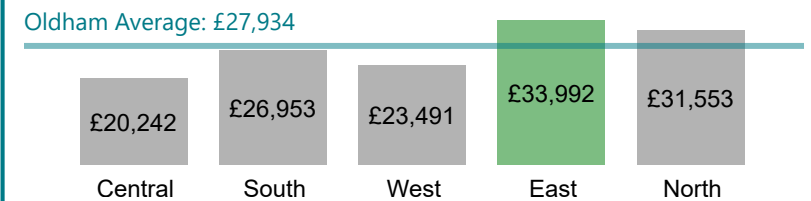
Youth Unemployment Rate

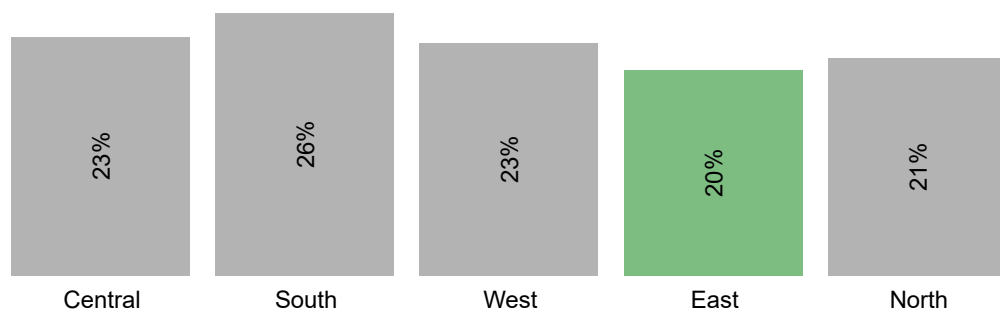

The rate across **England** is **22%**.

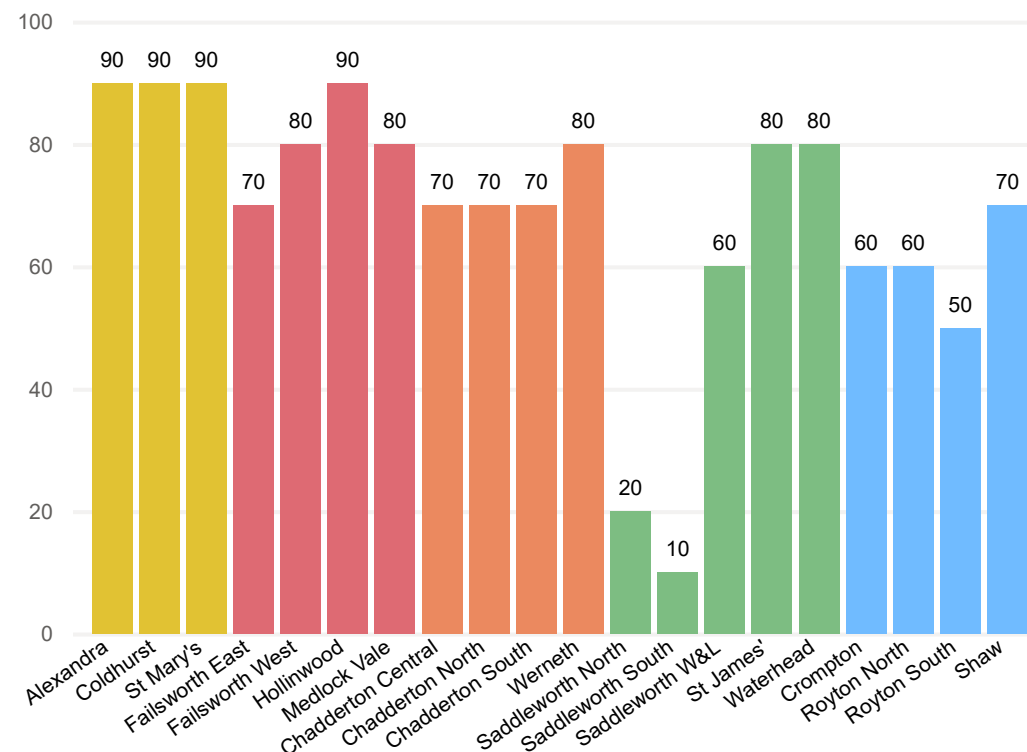


Child Poverty (IDACI)

IDACI (Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index) measures the proportion of all children aged 0 – 15 living in income deprived families.



The graph below is split into deciles, with a higher score being a more deprived area. A score of 10 means that ward is one of the 10% least deprived wards in the country. A score of 100 would mean that ward is one of the 10% most deprived wards in the country. A score of 90 means that ward is one of the 10 - 20% most deprived wards in the country.



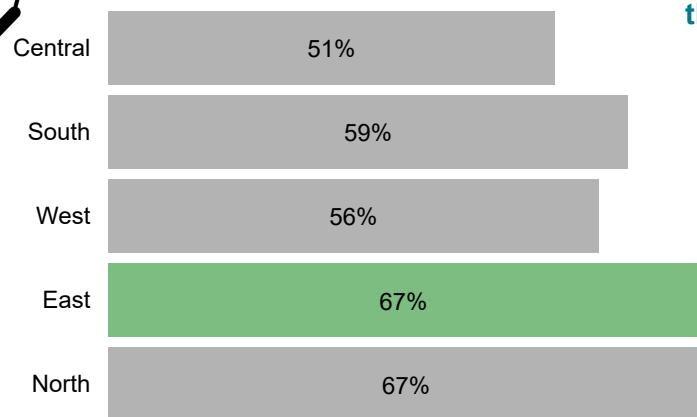
Good Level of Development by the end of Reception (GLD)

In 2022, **67%** of children in **East District** achieved the **GLD**. Alongside North District, this is the highest rate across Oldham.

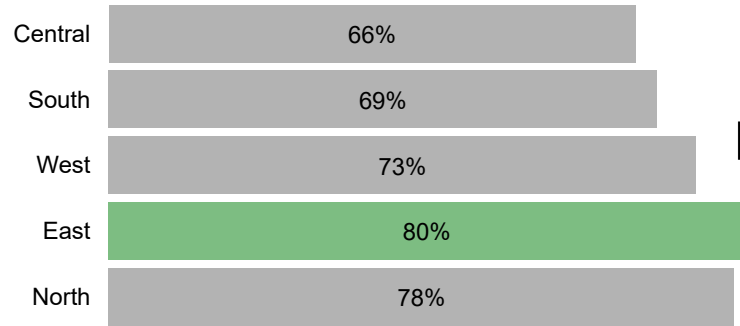

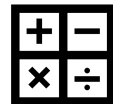

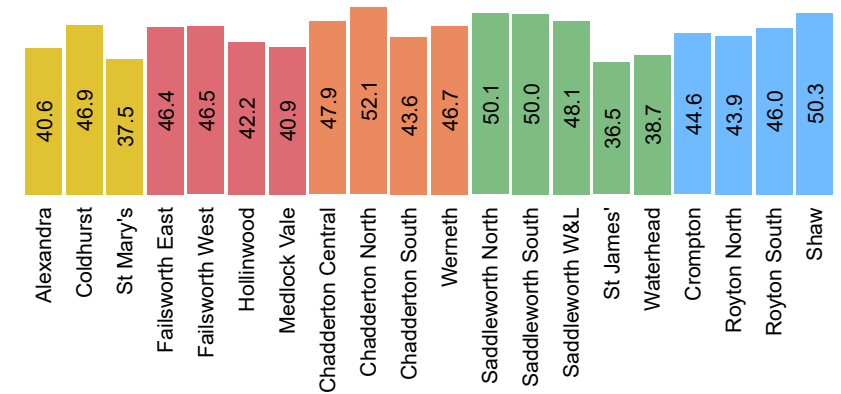

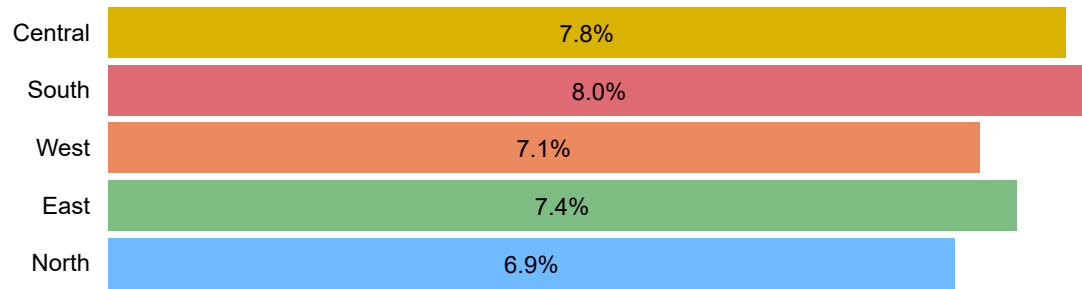

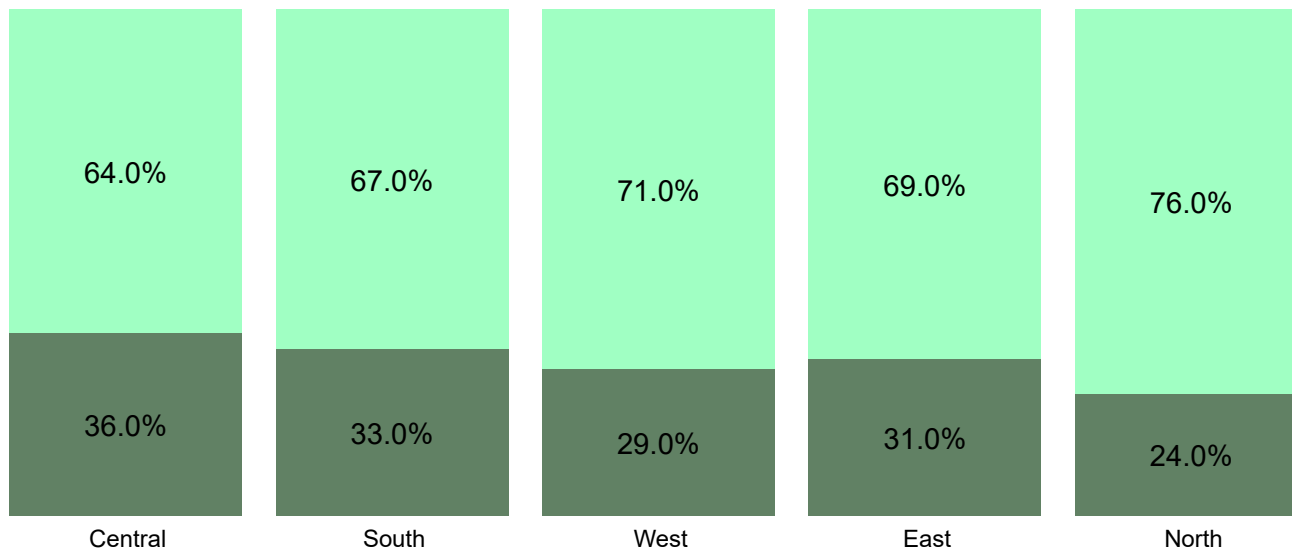
Percentage of school sessions missed for absence (2021/22)

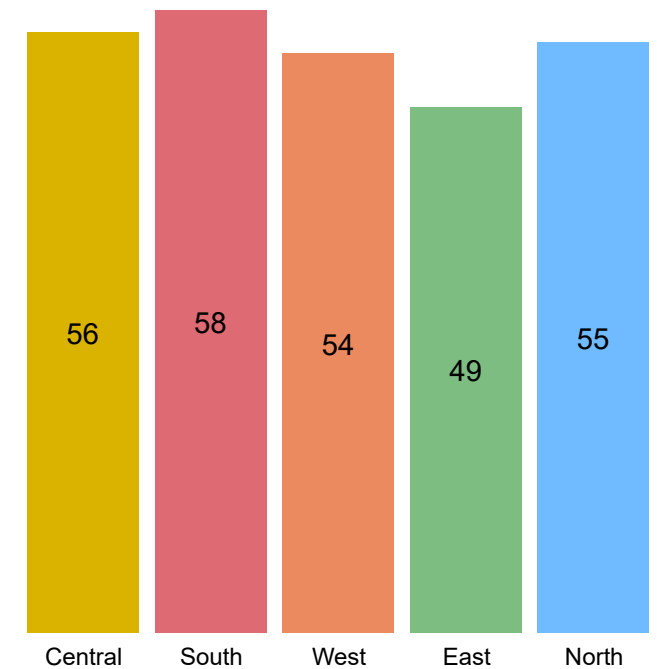
Percentage of authorised and unauthorised school absences (2021/22)

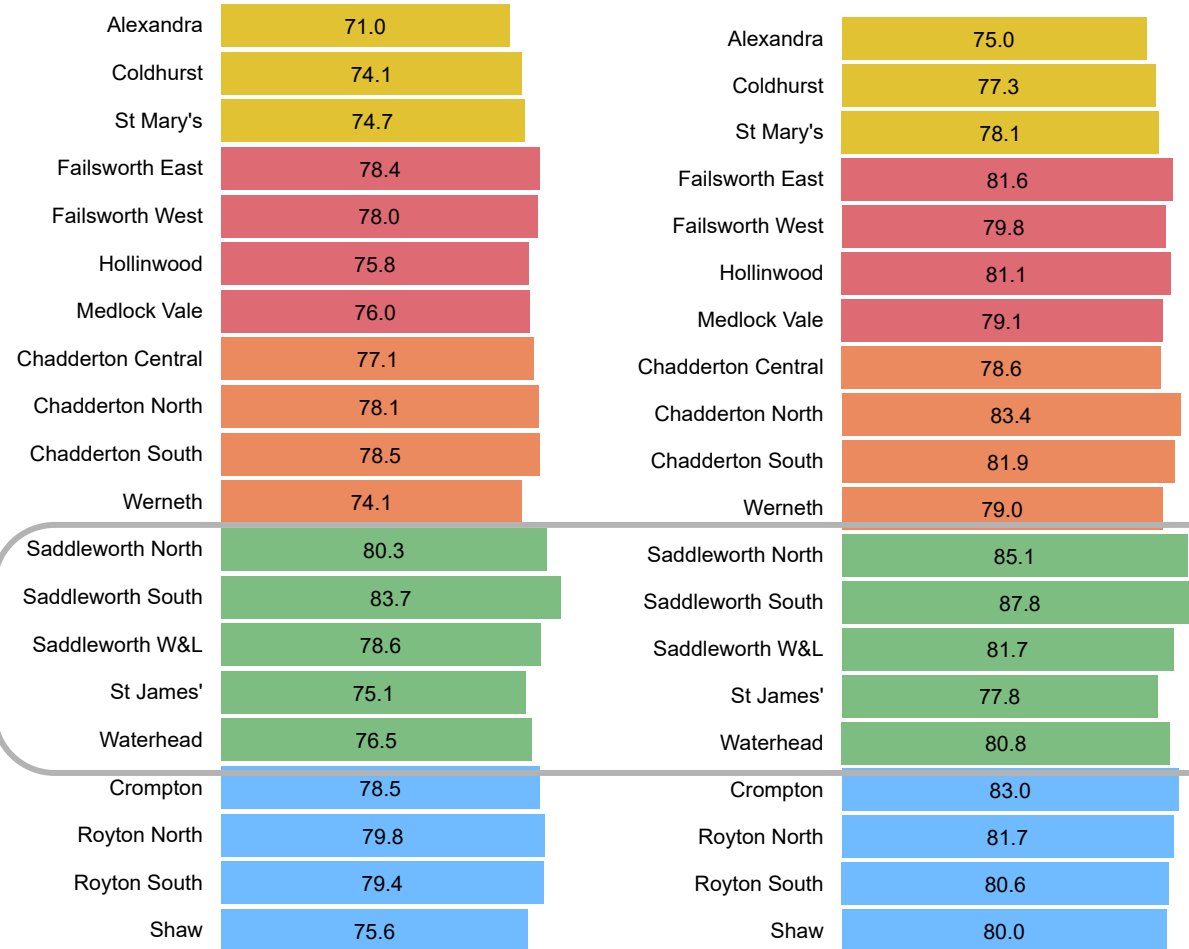

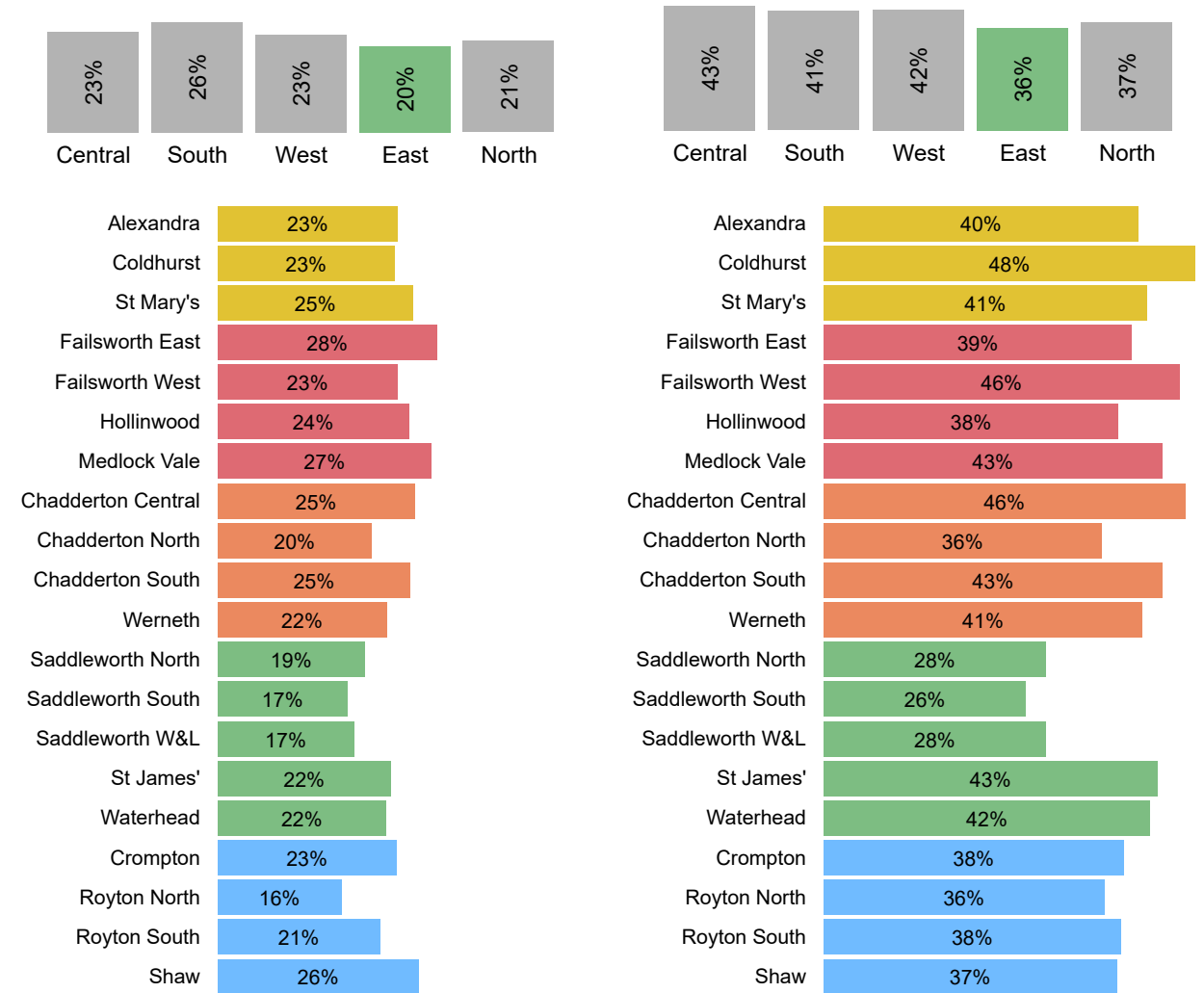

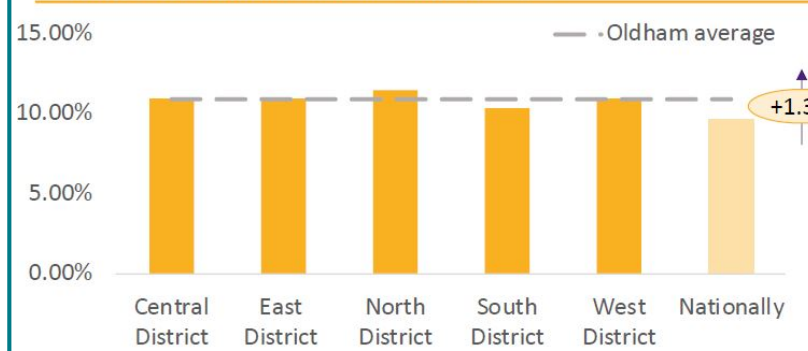

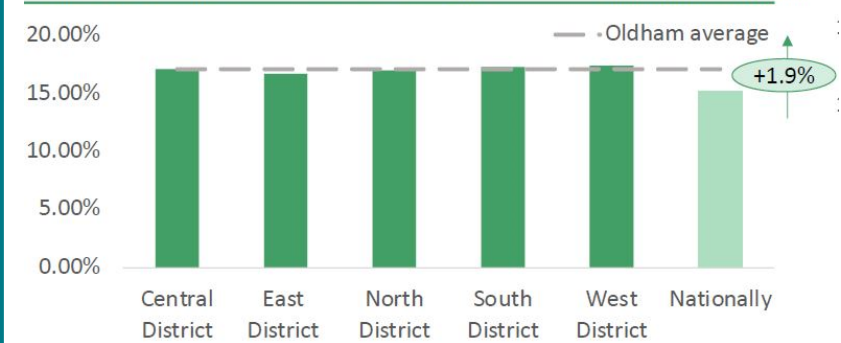
Obesity prevalence

Proportion of population that smoke in 2021/22

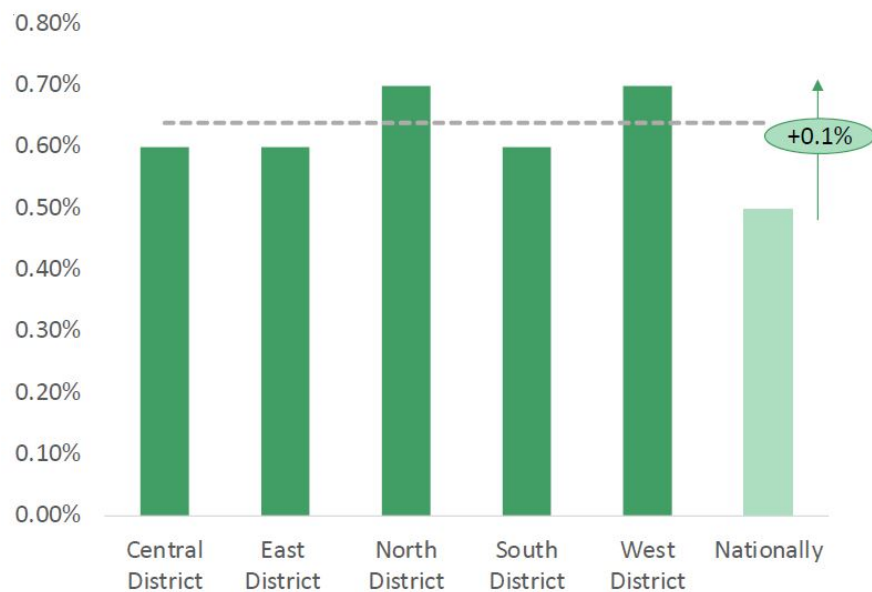

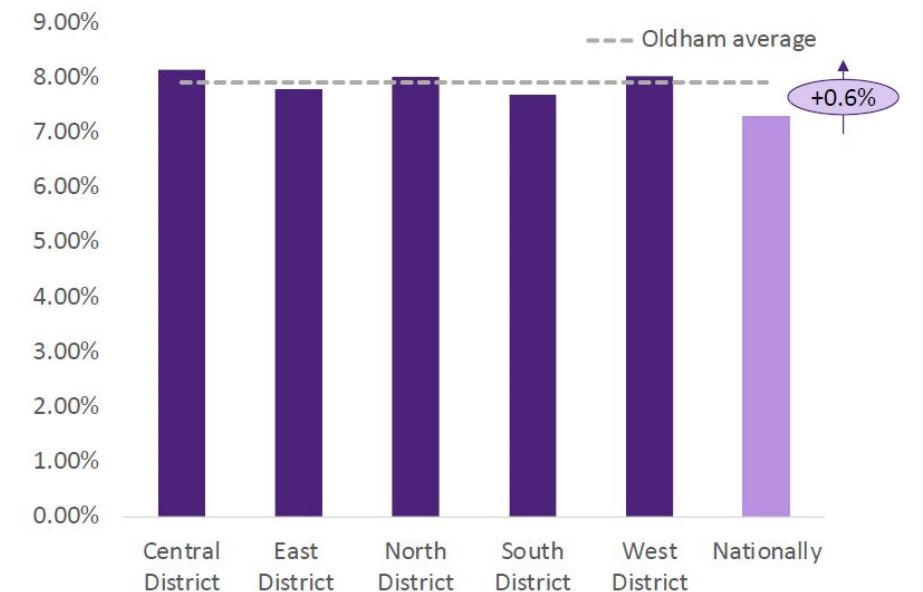

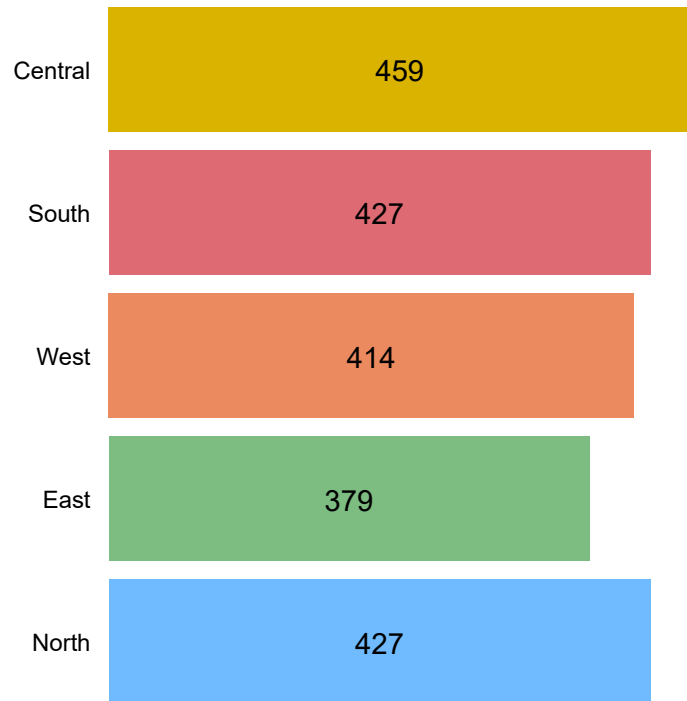
Diabetes mellitus prevalence - Type 1 and Type 2

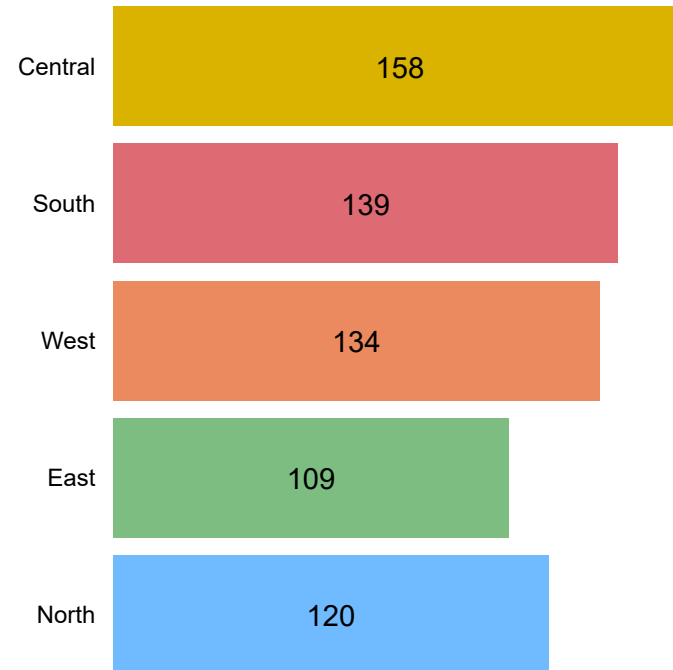

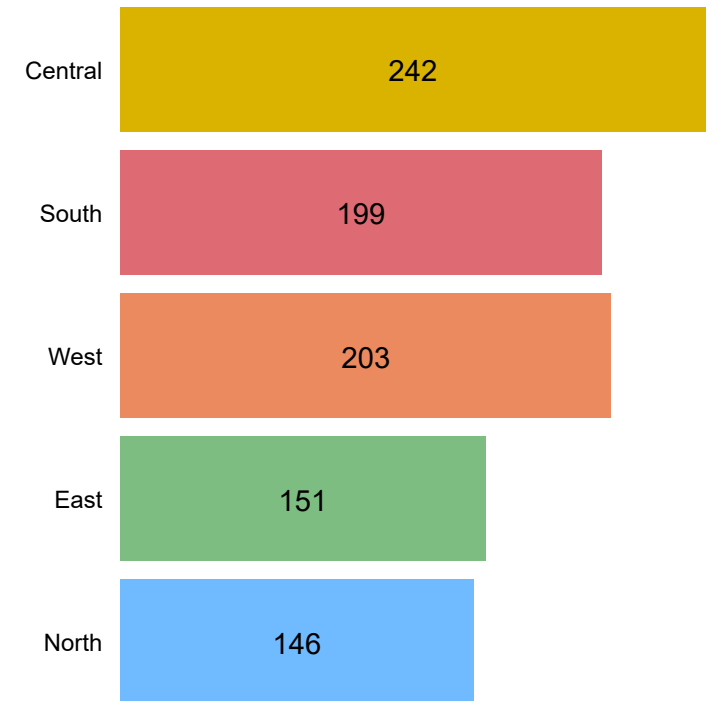

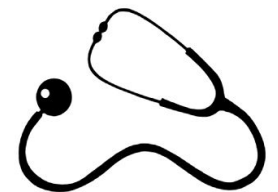
Non-elective Spells per 1,000, age-standardised (2022/23)



Elective Spells per 1,000, age-standardised (2022/23)

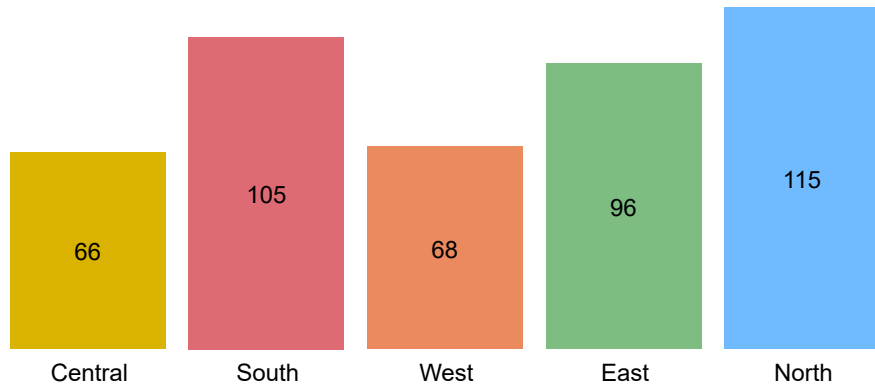

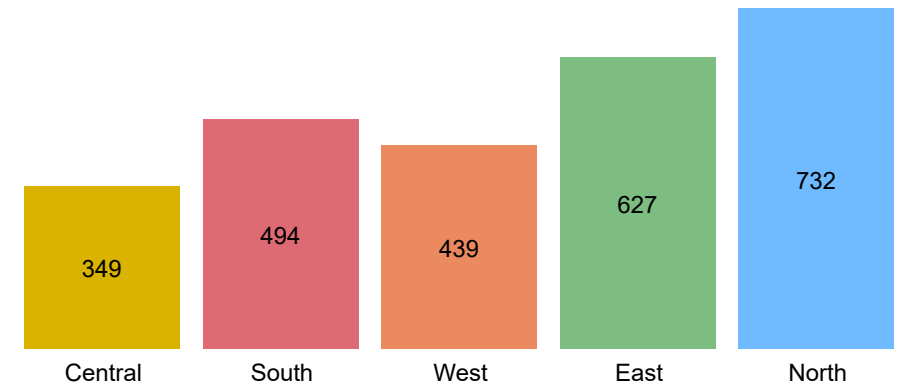

Children & Young People (0-18) Mental Health Referrals per 1,000 (2022/23)

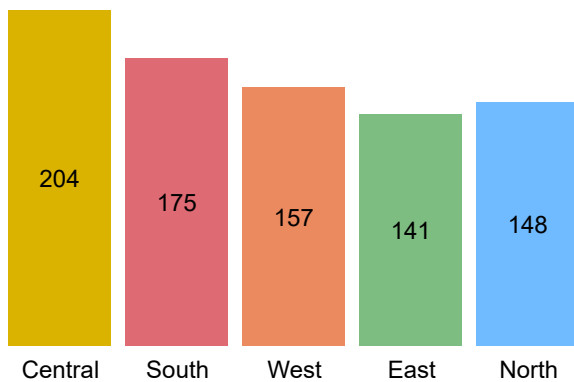

Children & Young People (0-18) Mental Health Contacts per 1,000 (2022/23)

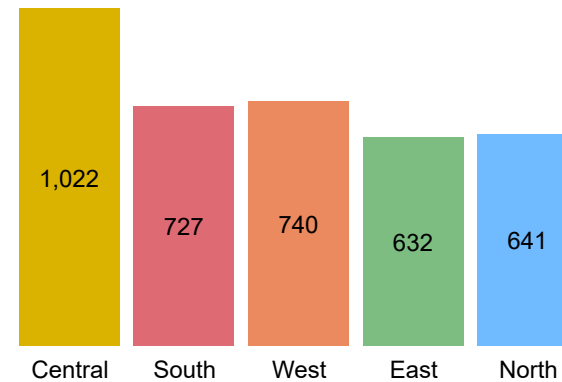


Adult Mental Health Referrals per 1,000 (2022/23)



East has **the lowest rate** of Adult Mental health contacts and referrals.

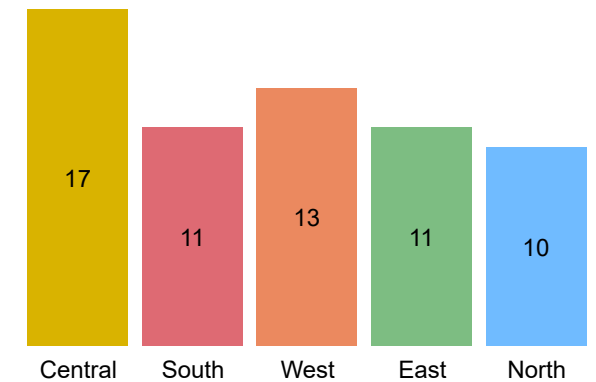
Adult Mental Health Contacts per 1,000 (2022/23)

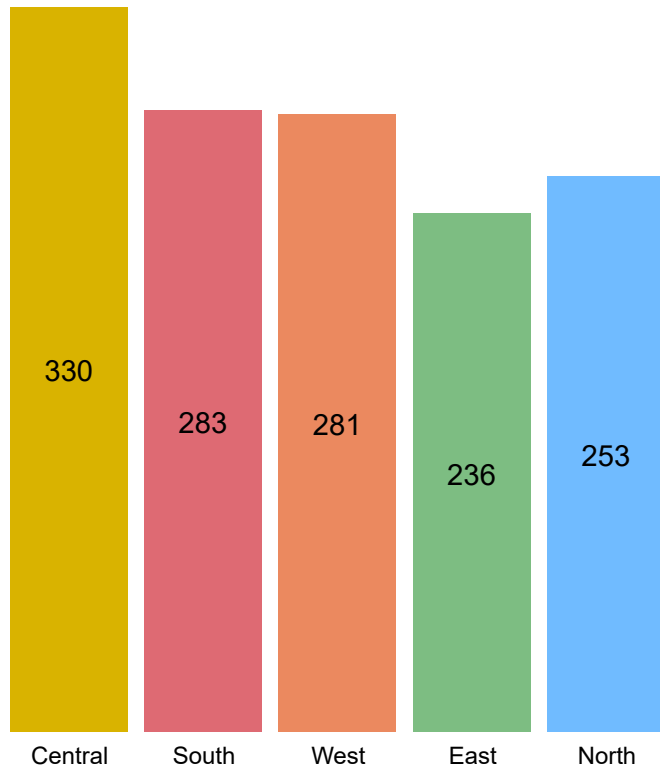


A&E Mental Health Attendances per 1,000 (2022/23)

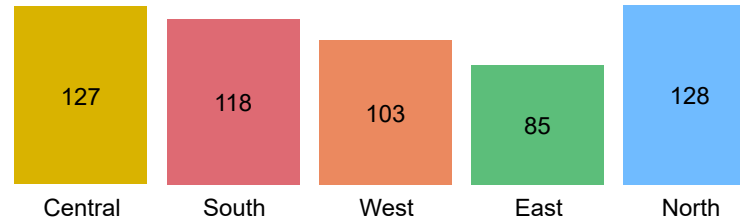

Number of 999 calls per 1,000 residents (2022/23)

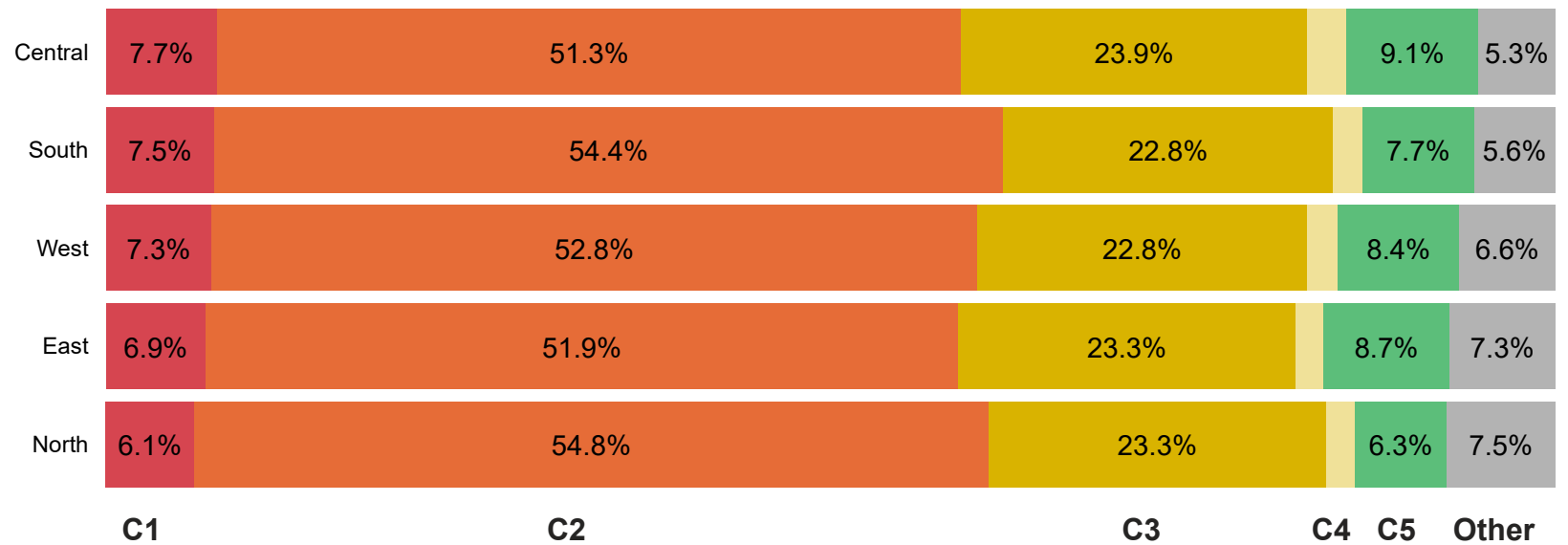

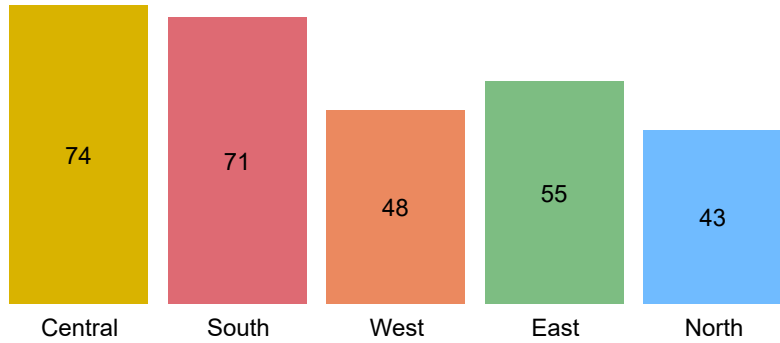
Distribution of ambulance calls by category (2022/23)

Category of call (C1 is most urgent) ● C1 ● C2 ● C3 ● C4 ● C5 ● Other

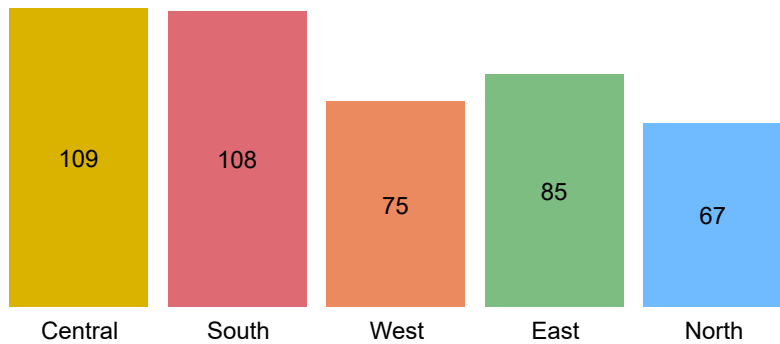

Children & Young People Social Care Referrals per 1,000 (2022/23)

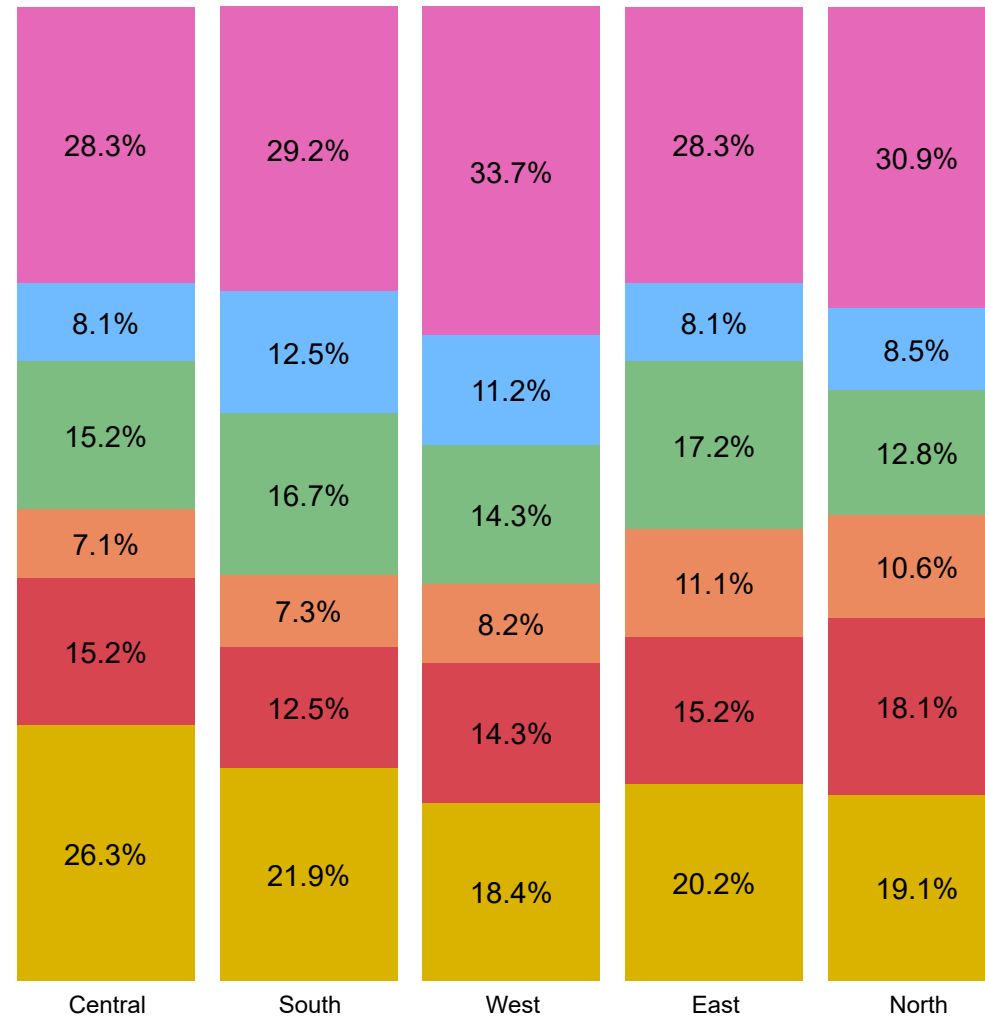

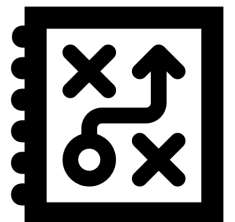


Social Care Referrals by Source (2022/23)

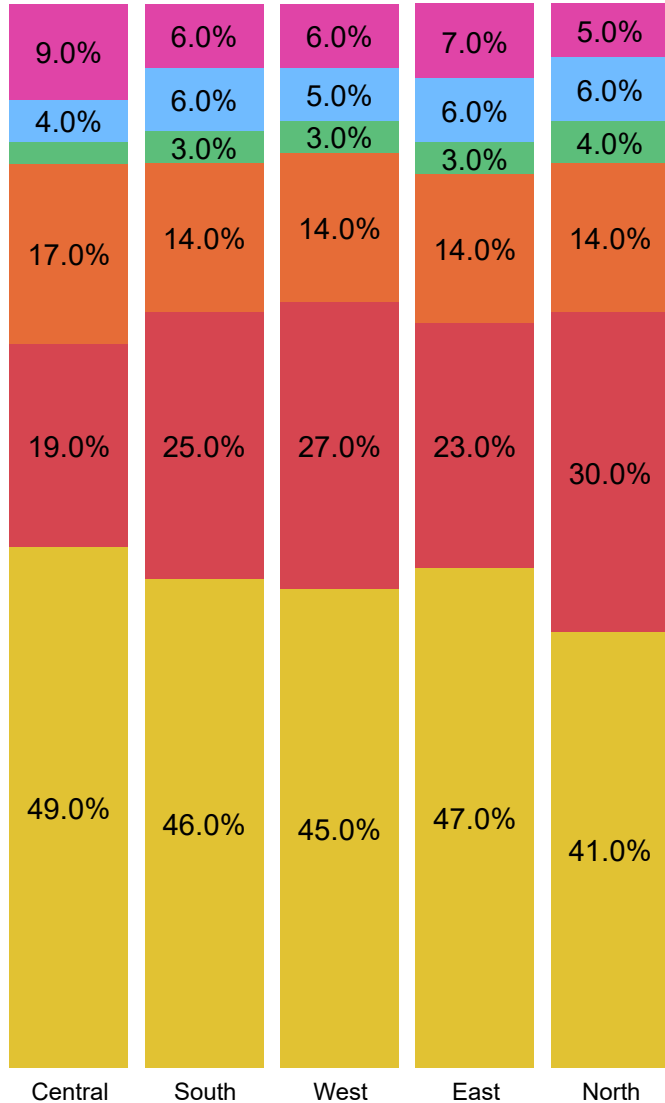

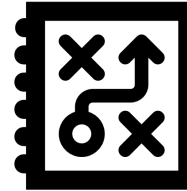

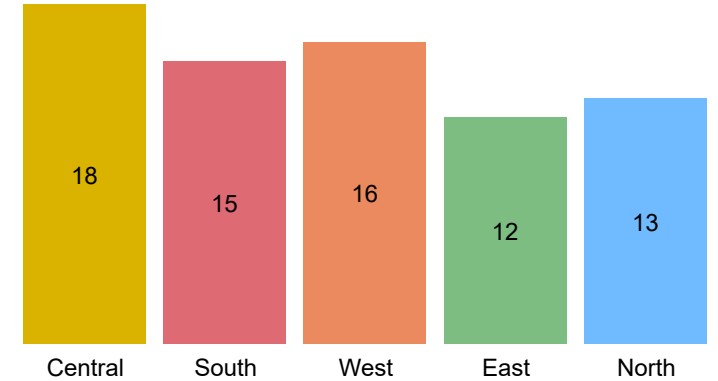

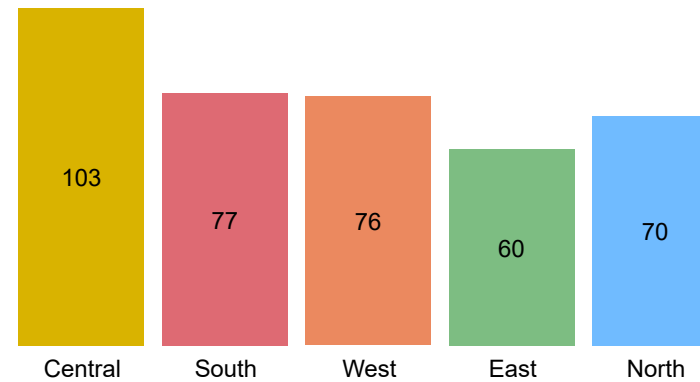
Adult Social Care Community Activity per 1,000 (18+), age-standardised (2022/23)

East District's rate of Social Care referrals is **lowest** across Oldham.

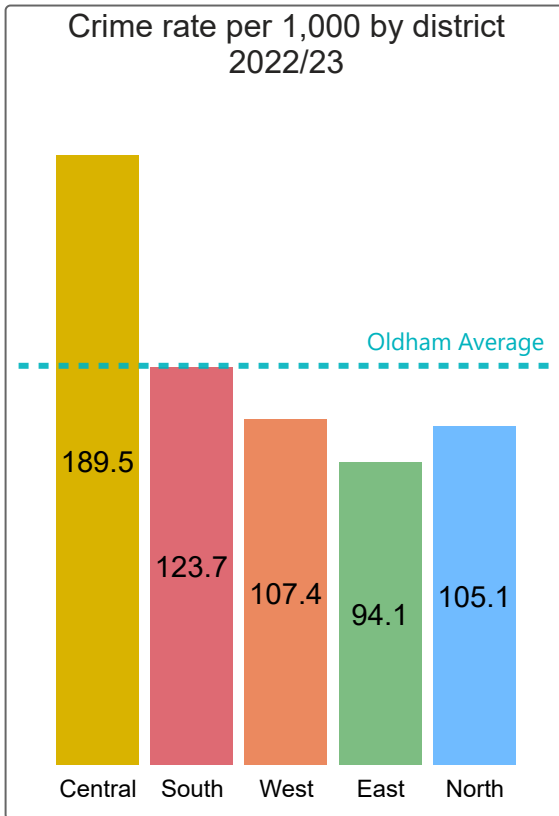

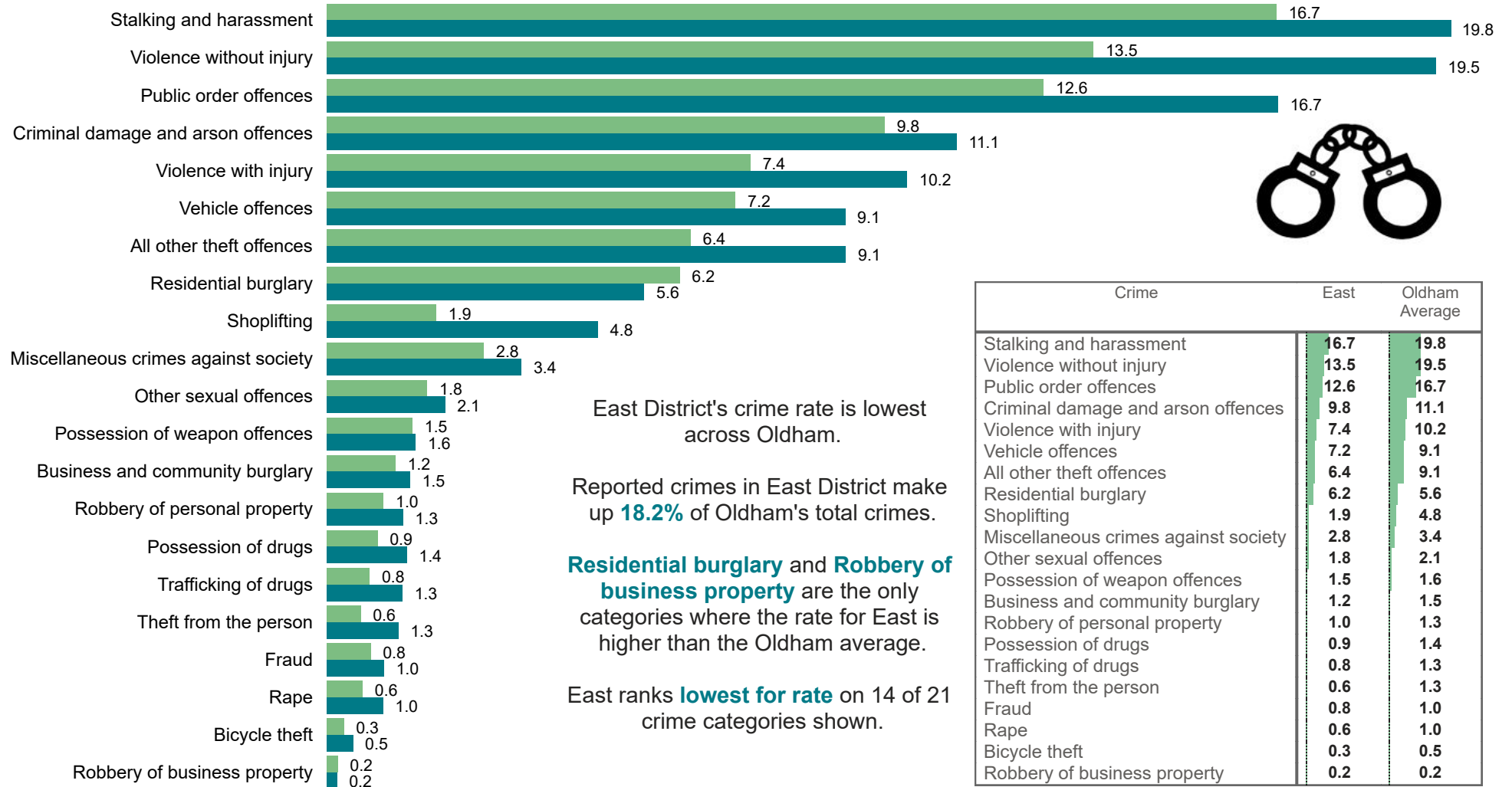
Crime rate per 1,000 by district 2022/23

East District's crime rate is lowest across Oldham.

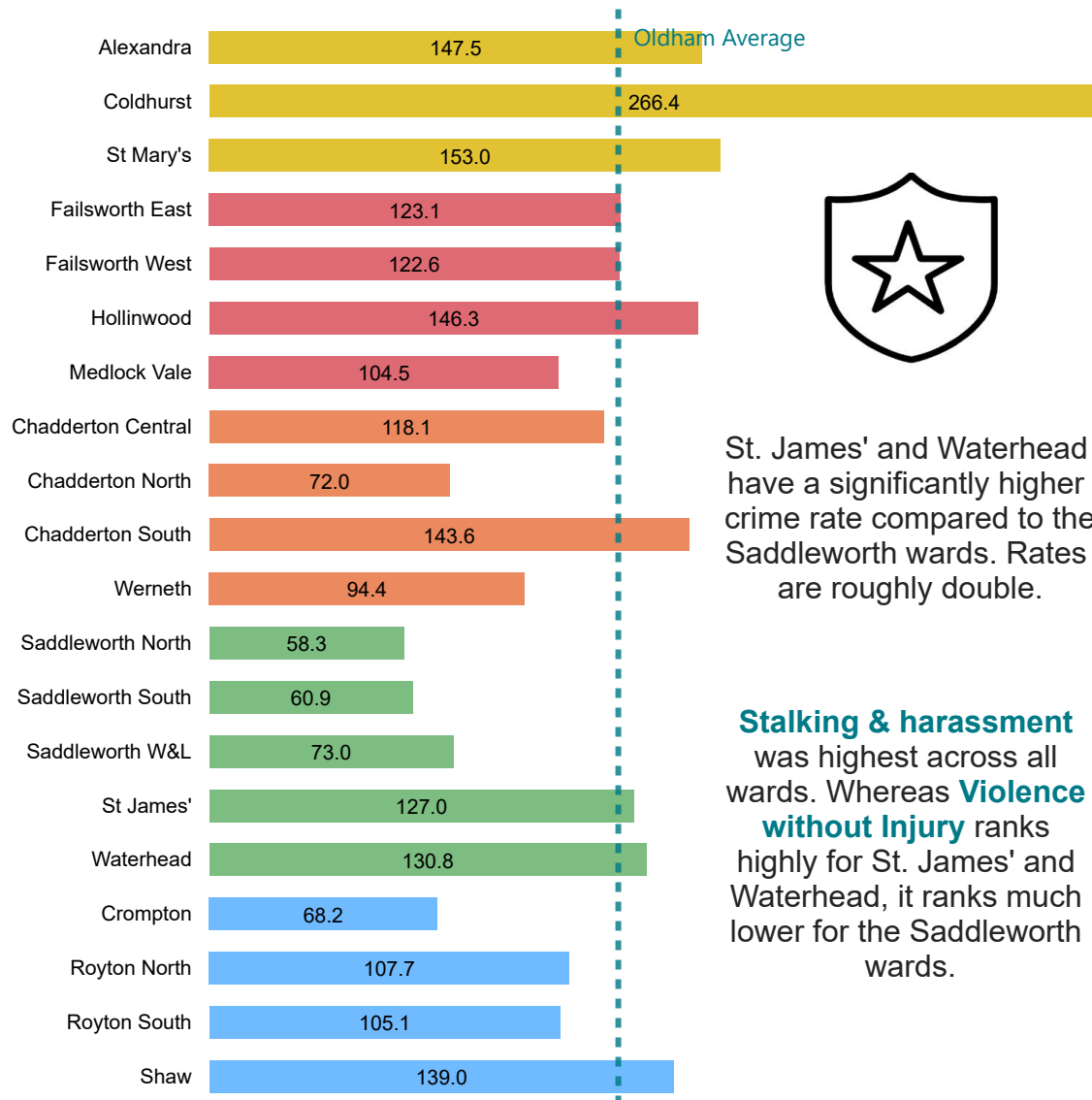
Reported crimes in East District make up **18.2%** of Oldham's total crimes.

Crime rate per 1,000 by Oldham ward, 2022/23



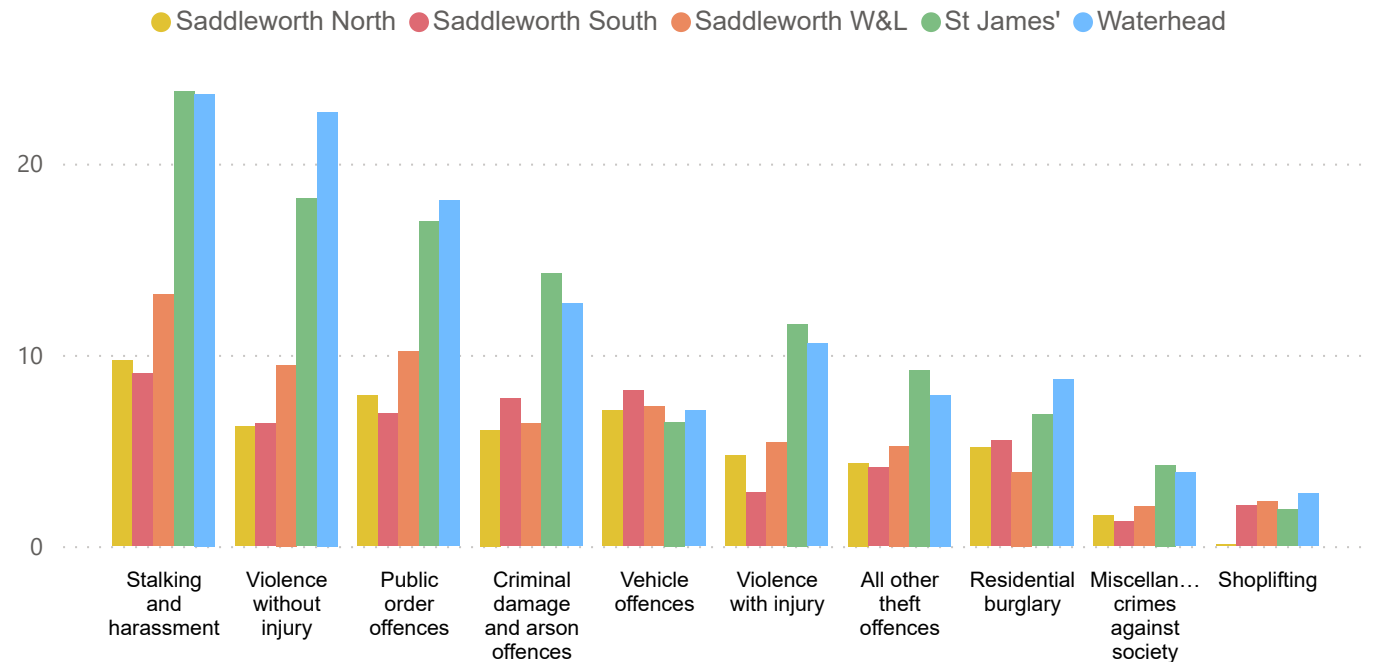
St. James' and Waterhead have a significantly higher crime rate compared to the Saddleworth wards. Rates are roughly double.

Stalking & harassment was highest across all wards. Whereas **Violence without injury** ranks highly for St. James' and Waterhead, it ranks much lower for the Saddleworth wards.
