District Summary

West District has the second highest **population** in Oldham. The district population grew by 11% between 2011 and 2021. The ward of Werneth saw the greatest growth of any in the borough.

Deprivation levels vary greatly within the district. Werneth is the most deprived area, followed by Chadderton Central. Although Chadderton South and Chadderton North show areas of high need, deprivation levels are lower overall.

Chadderton North is the only area of West district where the **median house price** falls above the Oldham average. Large differences are seen within the district, with a £115,000 average price difference between a home in Chadderton North and Werneth.

Unemployment rates are high in Chadderton Central and Werneth and fall below the Oldham average in Chadderton North and Chadderton South. West has the largest difference in rates between its wards of any district.

Chadderton Central has the lowest **median household income** of any ward in Oldham.

Pupils in West perform within the range of the Oldham averages for **Key Stage 1 Phonics Screening and Key Stage 2 SATS**, however the average **Attainment 8** score at Key Stage 4 is above the Oldham average and the highest of any district.

Rates of **childhood obesity** are high. Children in Year 6 have one of the highest rates of overweight or obesity in Oldham.

West has the highest rate of smoking within Oldham and also sees high rates of Diabetes, Depression and Obesity. Learning Disability rates are the highest across Oldham in West.

West District has low levels of **Child and Adolescent Mental Health** referrals and contacts. This may be a reflection on access to and utilisation of services rather than a difference in prevalence of mental health conditions in the district. **Adult Mental Health** service use is in line with Oldham averages.

West District has a low rate of both **Children's Social Care** activity and referrals. The district sees the lowest proportion of its referrals from Education and the highest proportion of its referrals from Police. **Adult Social Care** activity is relatively high, referrals are similar to the average for Oldham.

There are more crimes per 1,000 residents in **Chadderton South** than any other ward in West District. **Chadderton North** has the lowest crime rate of the district, and one of the lowest of any Oldham ward.



Population Growth

The West District's population is growing at the second fastest rate across the borough.

Whilst Oldham's population as a whole grew by 7.7% between 2011 and 2021, West's population grew by 11%.


But the district level figures hide significant variation between the wards:

During this time, Werneth's population grew by 22.2% and Chadderton Central's by 15.6%, whilst Chadderton South's grew by only 5% and Chadderton North's reduced by 0.2%

Werneth's growth rate is highest of any ward in the borough.









Indices of Deprivation




Average IMD Score




A higher score indicates a more deprived area.


Unemployment Rate

West has the second highest unemployment rate of the 5 districts, with an average rate of 6.7%.




Youth Unemployment Rate

West has the second lowest median household income of the 5 districts, with an average rate of £23,491.





Obesity in Reception


The West District has 23% of reception aged children overweight or obese, similar to the Oldham average.

In 2022, **56%** of children in West District **achieved the GLD**.






Child Poverty (IDACI)



Percentage of authorised and unauthorised school absences (2021/22)







Life Expectancy at Birth (Years)







Percentage of children overweight or obese







A&E Attendances per 1,000, age-standardised (2022/23)







Elective Spells per 1,000, age-standardised (2022/23)













Children & Young People (0-18) Mental Health Contacts per 1,000 (2022/23)




Adult Mental Health Referrals per 1,000 (2022/23)


Adult Mental Health Contacts per 1,000 (2022/23)




A&E Mental Health Attendances per 1,000 (2022/23)

Number of 999 calls per 1,000 residents (2022/23)




Distribution of ambulance calls by category (2022/23)

Cetegory of call (C1 is most urgent) ●C1 ●C2 ●C3 ●C4 ●C5 ●Other



Children & Young People Social Care Activity per 1,000 (2022/23)




Children & Young People Social Care Referrals per 1,000 (2022/23)

Social Care Referrals by Source (2022/23)













Chadderton North has the lowest crime rate of the district, and one of the lowest of any Oldham ward.


Stalking and harassment, violence without injury and public order offences were the top 3 offences for all wards within West.
